


Yemeniettes Broadcast Premiere



We are delighted to announce that *Yemeniettes*, Layalina's latest multiple award-winning feature documentary, had its world broadcast premiere on September 5th. The show aired in primetime on the popular Yemeni channel Al-Saeedah TV and repeated twice in 24 hours. Al-Saeedah promoted the premiere heavily starting on July 27th.

A few days after the premiere, Yemen TV, the state-run television station, endured three days of mortar attacks and went offline briefly, becoming a focal point in the power struggle between Iranian-backed Houthi rebels and the government. At a time when Yemen's security situation is precarious and the country is teetering on the brink, we are on the air with a powerful show, leveraging the power of education-entertainment television programming to bring a vision of a more hopeful future into Yemeni homes.


Layalina has partnered with a third-party vendor to conduct an evaluation of *Yemeniettes*' impact on viewer attitudes following the Yemen broadcasts. We look forward to sharing evaluation findings once the fifteen repeat broadcasts of the film conclude in a few months.

Layalina's Shows Win Eight Awards

In June, the prestigious Accolade Global Film Competition honored Layalina's recent productions. *Generation Entrepreneur* won the Award of Excellence in the Television Documentary Series category and *Yemeniettes* won the Award of Merit in the Feature Documentary category. Accolade awards recognize industry professionals who "demonstrate exceptional achievement in craft and creativity" and contribute to profound social change.

In August, the IndieFest Film Awards, a top-tier international awards competition that recognizes "cinematic gems and unique voices," honored Layalina with a total of six awards. *Generation Entrepreneur* won an Award of Excellence in three categories: Miniseries, Reality Programming and Use of Film for Social Change. *Yemeniettes* also swept the competition, winning an Award of Excellence in Contemporary Issues as well as two Awards of Merit in the categories of Documentary Feature and Viewer Impact.

We are delighted that our peers in the industry are honoring Layalina's work. *Yemeniettes* and *Generation Entrepreneur* are created, written and executive produced by Leon Shahabian and directed and edited by Shawn Thompson.

The World Congress, which was previously held in Germany, Jordan and Spain, gathered this year in Ankara, Turkey.
